An important first step to starting a business is **developing a Business Plan**. Building the plan requires knowledge about yourself, the market, and the solutions or products you want to offer and can be useful to secure financing.

- What is your business concept?
- What are the estimated costs of opening and operating?
- What are the strengths and weaknesses of your idea?
- What is the market environment?
- Who are your competitors?
- Are you ready to run a business?

The Small Business Administration offers many resources to assist in business planning. **SCORE** is a non-profit association which through education and mentorship aims to help small business startups grow and achieve their business goals. They are able to provide their services at no charge or a very low cost.

The Women's Enterprise Development Center is a not-for-profit micro-enterprise development program servicing Westchester County and the Lower Hudson Valley. Its focus is to assist women through small business development including training, advisory services and access to capital.

How will you set up your business?

No matter what type of business you are in you will need to establish a **legal business organization**. Sole proprietorships, partnerships and corporations each have their own benefits and drawbacks. Choosing the right one can be complex; *please consult an attorney to learn more about your legal rights and obligations*.

The US Small Business Administration also provides information to guide you.

All businesses are required to file tax returns. To obtain the necessary **tax identification numbers**, contact the IRS as well as the NYS Department of Taxation & Finance. Your business may also be required to collect sales taxes and whether you are self-employed or have employees you will need to pay Social Security and Withholding Tax.

If your business will not be a corporation, limited partnership or limited liability company, and will not be operating under your own name, you will need to **register your business name** with the Westchester County Clerk. Prior to visiting you are encouraged to check your business name for availability.

If you have employees, NYS requires that you obtain Worker's Compensation **Insurance**. Liability insurance is a good idea to protect your assets, especially if you are working at your clients' properties.

Where should you locate your business?

Now that you have a business plan and know the type of business structure you will be operating under you will need to determine where your business will be located. Before you lease or purchase a building or property you should determine the **zoning for that site**. Zoning is the City's tool for protecting neighborhoods and the City as a whole from incompatible uses. The Planning staff of the City's **Department of Development** can help in providing zoning information and guidance in working with real estate agents specializing in commercial spaces.

The **Bureau of Buildings** can help obtain specific approvals that may be needed. One key step that can avoid problems later is to check for open permits or violation on the property *before* you sign a lease.

Any one of many locations throughout New Rochelle could be the right one for your business. Significant focus is on the downtown area with a new zoning plan which paves the way for vibrant, yet intelligently designed new development. It permits construction of up to 990,000 square feet of new retail space, 1,805,000 square feet of new non-medical office space, 420,000 square feet of medical office space and 5,500 apartments, hundreds of which will be affordable housing – changing the daytime and evening population of the downtown area.

How will you fund your business?

One of the biggest concerns with getting your business started or growing is **financing**. In addition to the traditional sources of financing through a **bank**, or family and friends, other alternatives may be available. Grants are often requested but hard to come by.

The NR **Industrial Development Agency** (IDA) and NR Corporation for **Local Development** (CLD) provide support to manufacturing and commercial businesses, residential rental builders and non-profit institutions. It can be a vehicle for long term, low-interest financial assistance for capital projects. Financing can be used for acquisition, expansion, rehab, and purchase of equipment through the issuance of State bonds and other incentives, such as mortgage, sales and property tax exemptions.

Partner agencies provide sources of funding along with education and planning resources. The U.S. **Small Business Administration** has a new tool to help borrowers find lenders (LINC) plus a directory of available loans and grants.

What permits or licenses do you need to obtain?

Whether you are building new or renovating an existing property, it is important that you end up with a safe place to do business. Contact the City's **Bureau of Buildings** to check for existing permits or violations, review plans, obtain new permits (building, plumbing, electrical, sign) and do site inspections. All construction must be approved by the Bureau of Buildings *prior to starting work* and on completion.

For street openings or site work, contact the Department of Public Works. Depending upon the nature of your business, the Police and/or Fire Departments may need to inspect the premises.

If you are **preparing or serving food**, you will need a license from the Westchester County Health Department. Serving alcohol requires a permit from New York state.

Certain types of businesses (i.e. Pawn Shops, Secondhand Auto Dealers, Cabarets, Secondhand Merchandise Dealers) must obtain a special permit/license from the **City Clerk**.

The City's Business Ambassador manages a **registry of businesses** in New Rochelle. Within one month of opening, new retail businesses are required to register and all other businesses are encouraged to do so. Registration is free and provides many benefits.

How can your storefront attract more customers?

All business owners want customers to walk through their door. An enticing storefront makes it more likely to happen.

To support safety and appearance, the city of New Rochelle has **zoning code** that regulates:

- Signs and awnings
- Window displays
- Safety of doors & stairways
- Placement of items on sidewalks.

Planters and sidewalk cafés placed on the public way **require a permit** from the Department of Development.

Wall **signage**, both temporary like a “Grand Opening” sign or permanent require permits from the Bureau of Buildings.

Window signage (whether one large sign or many small ones) is limited to covering *no more than 15%* of available window space. No signage can be pasted or painted to the exterior of windows, doors or building. Blinking, flashing or overly bright signs are not permitted.

Also, not permitted - easel type signs, feather or wind signs, or any other items placed on the sidewalk.

New Rochelle has a **Sign, Awning & Façade program** to help subsidize the cost for improvements to signage and storefront facades.

How can you expand your marketing and promotion?

An exciting free program highlighting businesses that demonstrate a commitment to excellence and customer attraction is in place in the City of New Rochelle. As part of the City's ambitious redevelopment plan, all New Rochelle businesses are invited to apply - at no cost - to the **Featured Business Program**, coordinated by the City's Department of Development.

Featured Businesses will receive City support for advertising and co-marketing activities, starting with a window decal that corresponds to an online map available on the City's website and on the city-wide interactive Wi-Fi kiosks. The decals are color-coded to four categories (Food / Dining, Arts / Entertainment, Retail and Services).

Additionally, to enable greater access to residents of the new development in New Rochelle, Featured Businesses are included in the New Downtown Residence Card program. This program provides new residents special offers at the Featured Businesses throughout the City.

All businesses in New Rochelle are eligible to apply and will qualify based on 5 criteria that demonstrate customer appeal, commitment to excellence, and compliance with all City ordinances.

How can you bid on local, county, state and federal contract opportunities?

Government offices procure a significant amount of products and services. Opportunities to bid for these are coordinated through different purchasing programs.

The **City of New Rochelle** posts bids on the city website. You can sign up to be notified when new bids are requested.

Forty municipalities across NY, including New Rochelle, use the Empire State Purchasing Group to publish bids. The [Procurement Technical Assistance Center](#) can help you understand the competitive bidding process and find opportunities appropriate for your company.

WestWorks is a weekly synopsis of advertised contracts, bid opening results and awarded contract and agreements.

Additional opportunities to compete are available for women and minority owned businesses plus for disadvantaged business enterprises. There is a rigorous process to qualify for each of these with very specific criteria. Contact the Business Ambassador or Westchester County **MWBE** Office to understand the guidelines and process.
